Those present were Elaine Erdahl, Nick Neibauer-Adams, Mackinzie Burke, Salome Hansen, Karl Tollefson, Brandon Neibauer-Adams, Jami Revier, and Sue Lindberg. Sue Lindberg opened with devotions from Hebrews 12:1-2.

Secretary's Report was reviewed via email and accepted as presented. M/S/A. (Nick/Jami)

Treasurer's and Financial Secretary's Report: Several discussions occurred including the Fair worship offering and the Fair stand report. The Fair Offering was \$900 and will be donated to Lutheran World Relief as designated by the Parish Council. The net income from the Fair stand was \$15,743.62. Plans were tabled as to where these funds will be designated. The report was accepted as presented.

Pastor's Reports: Pastor Dan is on vacation for 3 weeks and was not present. He will be doing a wedding and two graveside funeral services during this time. Both Pastor Dan and Pastor Darrell will be preaching again starting September 8th. There will be a Global Missions All-Parish Worship Service on September 1st for all parish churches at Concordia, with coffee to follow. Rally Sunday/Backpack Sunday will be September 8th.

Committee Reports:

Home & Church Life: (Liz) Liz was not present. The Bingo Spring Fling was held June 23rd with approximately 35 people attending with lots of fun and everyone winning a prize. Plans are to have a similar event in November again.

Outreach: (Mackinzie) Mackinzie is checking on having outreach kits available for visitors reaching out to the church.
Parsonage Update: A report was given on the remodeling project. Loren Abel and Trevor DesRosier are working on the bathroom, getting estimates for the kitchen cabinets, planning on removing a wall, and checking the eaves and steps. The plumber has fixed the bathroom leak.

Education: (Tina) Tina was not present. Rally and Backpack Sunday will be September 8th. The Noisy Offering will be reviewed with students and teachers, making the decision on which charity/charities will receive this gift.

Daycare: (Brandon) Brandon has nothing new to report.

Worship: (Jami) Jami reports the congregation likes having singers leading the hymns during the services. Time and Talent sheets will be handed out on Rally Sunday and will include leading the hymns during services, helping with the Fair Stand, and helping with recording the Sunday services for TV.

Management and Finance: (Nick) Nick obtained a quote for needed work on the bell tower. Nick hopes to get more quotes for this project.

Old Business: A motion M/S/A (Mackinzie/Sue) to purchase 1500 gallons of summer fill pre-buy propane was passed. The sanctuary bulbs are here to be installed by the fire department when they are able. The church cleaning has been completed and smells and looks great. Thank you to everyone for their willingness to help.

New Business: A discussion regarding charity donations was tabled for a later time. There have been instances of strangers being found in the church. Discussion was had about which door should be open while the office managers are working. The double door adjacent to the office will be open. When church events occur, the other doors will be open for use, starting August 19th.

The next council meeting is scheduled for September 10th. A motion to adjourn was made @ 9:08pm. M/S/A

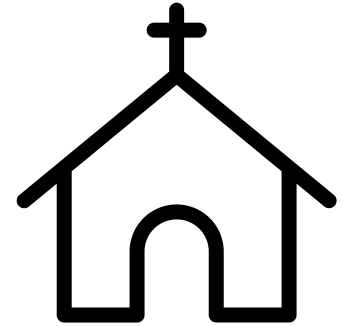

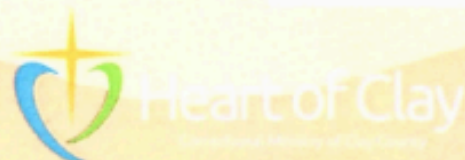
