September 10, 2024

President Elaine Erdahl called Concordia's Church Council meeting to order @ 7:00 pm on September 10, 2024. Those present were Elaine Erdahl, Dan Morton, Tina Sandberg, Liz Lisburg, Nick Neibauer-Adams, Mackinzie Burke, Salome Hansen, Karl Tollefson, Brandon Neibauer-Adams, Jami Revier, Sue Lindberg and Kip Fontaine from the Parish Board.

Kip Fontaine was welcomed and introduced to the council as a member of the ELCA's Northwest Minnesota synod council. He was present to bring greetings and information to our council from the Synod office.

Elaine opened with devotions from Psalm 116.

<u>Secretary's Report</u> was reviewed as emailed. Karl moved to accept the report, seconded by Jami and carried.

<u>Treasurer's and Financial Secretary's Report</u>: The treasurer's report was accepted as presented. Nick moved, seconded by Sue and was carried, to close out the debit card account at the Red River State Bank in Fertile.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Dan is back from vacation. Confirmation classes are starting. There are no weddings scheduled in the near future.

Parish Report: (Kip) Kip reported that the Synod has authorized 12 weeks FMLA, "Family Leave" to Genelle Netland, Assistant to the Bishop, due to her son being involved in a serious car accident in August. Bishop Tesch will be covering the call process for Pastor Genelle Netland during her Family Medical leave. Tina, reported from the call committee that several people have shown interest with 3 good prospects. Jami Morvig, our SAM, Synod Authorized Minister, will continue to assist Pastor Dan and Pastor Darrell with the Parish needs. On behalf of the synod council, Kip thanked Concordia for their generous financial and prayer support of the NWMN Synod, the ELCA, as well as the Global Mission of the church.

Committee Reports:

Home & church Life: (Liz) Plans are to have a Parish wide event in November.

Outreach: (Mackinzie) Mackinzie is researching kits for visitors from the church. There is a need for winter clothing for residents of the Care and Share in Crookston. All the parish members can donate gently used winter clothing for men, women, and children of all ages and sizes.

The dates and locations to collect these items will be designated in the church bulletins.

<u>Parsonage Update</u>: Loren Abel and Trevor Derosier are installing the new shower door this week. <u>Education:</u> (Tina) Rally and Backpack Sunday was September 8th. Bibles were handed out to our Third Graders. The Sunday School children and teachers will decide what mission project they wish to support with their 2023-2024 Offering as well as the Noisy Offering. All the white

boards are up in the education unit. Ideas are being reviewed for adult education classes.

<u>Daycare</u>: (Brandon) A discussion on locked doors in the daycare and chapel area was held. Nick will do further research on this.

Worship: (Jami) Time and Talent sheets were handed out on Rally Sunday. There is another person interested in helping video the church services on Sundays.

Management and Finance: (Nick) Nick is checking on more quotes for the work on the bell tower. A motion was made by Brandon, seconded by Tina, to send out "Keep the Heat" letters on October 1st and passed. \$2,025.00 was spent on pre-pay fuel in August.

Old Business: Karl moved, seconded by Jami and carried to give three thousand dollars from the Fair Stand profits to the Concordia WELCA, to be used for missions; five thousand dollars of the profits to remain in the account for any projects that may need to be completed and as startup funds for the 2025 expenses; and the remaining balance of approximated \$7,700 to be added to Concordia's General account.

New Business: Jon will purchase a new cordless vacuum for the sanctuary floors. Nick moved that donations and memorials that have been designated to "Water to Thrive" (\$945 from the Memorial Account and \$580 of donations in the Well fund) will be given to help complete the eighth well "Water to Thrive" for the United in Christ Lutheran Parish. The remaining unpaid balance of approximately \$1000 will be paid in full with money from the General Fund. The motion was seconded by Mackinzie and carried.

A motion to adjourn the meeting was made @ 8:20pm. (Brandon/Tina). M/S/A

Faaberg Council Meeting September 11, 2024

The Faaberg Council met on Wednesday, September 11, 2024 at 7pm in the church basement.

Attending were Peggy Ystenes, Sue Knutson, Brad Hanson, Brian Grunhovd, Steve Gullickson, Dave Harstad, Jeff Gullickson, Tony Grieve, Less Krogstad, Brenda Grunhovd and Vickie Thronson.

President Peggy called the meeting to order. After reviewing the Agenda, items added were Balcony Lights, Water Softener and Septic Pumping. With those additions a motion was made by Steve, seconded by Dave to approve the agenda. Motion carried.

Vickie read the Secretary's Report. Motion by Tony to approve, second by Brenda. Motion carried.

Peggy gave the Treasurer's Report. General Fund balance of \$9,075.64 with ACH offerings through September 5, and plate offerings through August 25. Peggy noted that Joe's Pest Control had sprayed for bugs (in August), and the \$171.80 bill has been paid. She also paid the bill of \$1,212.99 for the sewer pumping. A donation of \$1000.00 for the Church and \$1000.00 for the Cemetery was given by Elaine Krogstad of Crookston. The Cemetery account balance is \$2,534.44 with mowing paid through June. 2 CD's have been renewed, the Parsonage Sale CD of \$76,021.81 plus interest earned of \$5,204.17 totaled \$81,225.98; the Cemetery CD of \$24,380.21 plus interest earned of \$1668.98 totaled \$26049.19 We discussed pre-pay for propane and decided to buy 500 gallons @ \$1.64 The July Parish Payment was deferred. Motion by Brad to accept the Treasurer's Report, second by Les, motion carried.

Jeff read the minutes from the August Parish Council meeting.

Peggy had some reminders from the Parish: Thanksgiving Service will be November 26 at Concordia. 1st Communion Service will be March 2, 2025. The first Confirmation organizational meeting was being held tonight (Sept 11) at Concordia. Confirmation classes start next week. September 25 will be Confirmation at Concordia. Faaberg date yet to be determined.

Old Business: Brad had 2 bids for Soffit and Fascia repair and painting. One bid for \$14,310 (Josh Heinz) and one bid for \$3200 (Herman Miller). Sue made a motion seconded by Jeff to go with the \$3200 bid. Carried.

Brad and Rick Krogstad had looked for globes to fit the light fixtures in the balcony, but didn't find any of the right size. Sue will look for new balcony lights.

Olivia Harstad had cleaned up the shrubs and flower beds around the north and east sides of the entry. Thank you Olivia!

New Business: The septic needed to be pumped, and that was done in July.

Jeff Gullickson will look into spraying the flower beds for weeds.

Rick Krogstad was concerned that the softener is using too much salt. The guys will look at it.

Our next meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, October 9, 2024.




