UNITED IN CHRIST LUTHERAN PARISH BOARD MEETING October 17, 2024

Members present were Kip Fontaine, Verna Norland, Pr. Dan Morton, John Gullickson, Belinda Fjeld, Jeff Gullickson and Kristy Langved.

President Kip called the meeting to order at 9:00 and opened with a check-in around the room as to how each person felt their church and the parish were doing.

Kristy read the secretary's report. Belinda made a correction to the minutes to read that Daryl Haas took the offering from the fair worship home with him and it was not left at the Concordia Food Stand. Verna made a motion to accept the minutes with that correction, seconded by Belinda and carried.

In Lyle Fuchs' absence, Kip talked a bit about the accounting report. Lyle had suggested to Kip that we forgo November's contribution from each church. Kristy made a motion to accept the report as written and presented, seconded by Jeff and carried. We are each to look over the accounting report and bring suggestions to November's meeting, where we will create the budget for 2025.

Pastors report: Kip read a report from Jamie Morvig SAM. She talked about having completed some of her required classes and training. She talked about GriefShare, which she feels is going well. If it is to continue, we will need to purchase the new version of the book. She is doing worship services the 1st Wednesday of each month at Fair Meadow Assisted Living. She also serves communion during that service. She is doing visitation at Fair Meadow Nursing Home and some homebound. She has been preaching in churches monthly since May. She meets with her mentor by phone. She has some vacation time scheduled, and her goal is to start picking up 2 Sundays/month as needed starting in May 2025 and depending on the Call process.

Dan reported that all confirmation ceremony's/services are scheduled. He will be on vacation next week.

Old business: Pastoral call- Kip has visited with Bishop Tesch who reported that there are at least 2 candidates interested in our parish.

New business: Belinda has checked into a new copier/printer lease for the office. We are presently paying \$772/month and have some limitations with that lease. Belinda made a motion to enter into a new five (5) year lease with Marco at \$636.38/month, which is a monthly savings of approximately \$135.00/month and also included unlimited copies, both black & white and colored, training and maintenance. Verna seconded and it carried.

2025 parish budget was tabled until the November meeting.

Verna made a motion to have parish Thanksgiving service Tuesday, November 26, 2024, at Concordia, to instruct Concordia's worship committee to find participants from each church and that the offering from this service will go to the Care & Share and Fertile Food Shelf. Seconded by John and carried.

Jeff made a motion to forgo the monthly contribution from each church for the month of November. Seconded by John and carried. Each of us are to let church treasurers know.

Belinda made a motion to initiate a new church directory process, seconded by Verna and carried.

Belinda made a motion to contract with Sandhill Tax and Accounting, Inc as our new accounting firm. Seconded by John and carried.

John made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Verna and carried. We closed with the Lord's Prayer. Our next meeting is scheduled for November 21, 2024, at 9:00 a.m.
